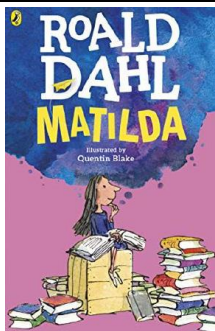

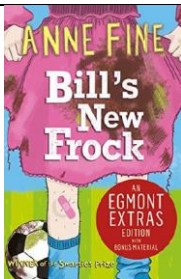


Humour

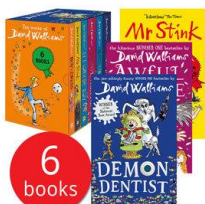
Bill's New Frock – Anne Fine

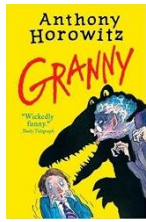
Knights and Bikes - Gabrielle Kent

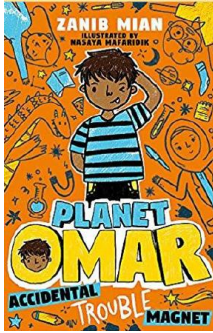

Granny – Anthony Horowitz

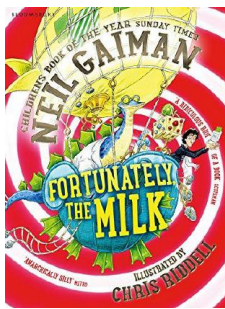

Accidental Trouble Magnet: Book 1 (Planet Omar) - Zanib Mian

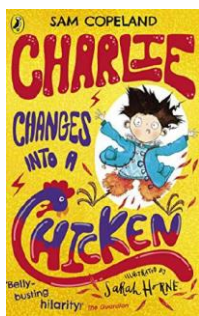

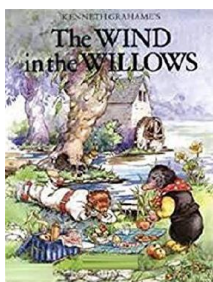
Charlie Changes into a Chicken – Sam Copeland

- And the school bully (who has Charlie in his sights)

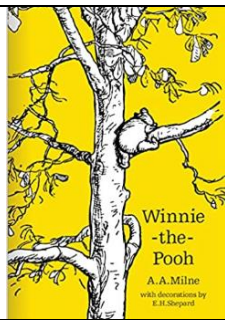
And even though every kid wants a superhero power, Charlie isn't keen on changing into a chicken in the middle of the school play.

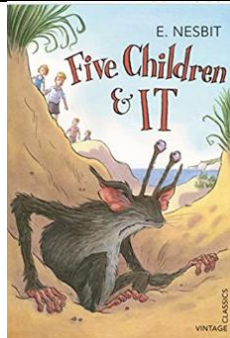
The Wind in the Willows - Kenneth Grahame

The Wind in the Willows is a children's novel by Scottish novelist Kenneth Grahame, first published in 1908. Alternatingly slow-moving and fast-paced, it focuses on four anthropomorphised animals: Mole, Rat (a European water vole), Toad, and Badger. They live in a pastoral version of Edwardian England. The novel is notable for its mixture of mysticism, adventure, morality, and camaraderie, and celebrated for its evocation of the nature of the Thames Valley.



Winnie-the-Pooh - A. A. Milne

Winnie-the-Pooh may be a bear of very little brain, but thanks to his friends Piglet, Eeyore and, of course, Christopher Robin, he's never far from an adventure. In this story Pooh gets into a tight place, nearly catches a Woozle and heads off on an 'expedition' to the North Pole with the other animals.

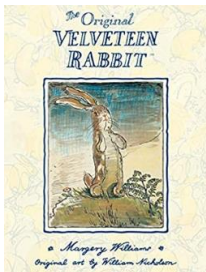

The Velveteen Rabbit - Margery Williams

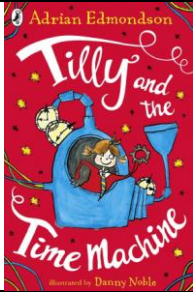

Tilly and the Time Machine - Adrian Edmondson

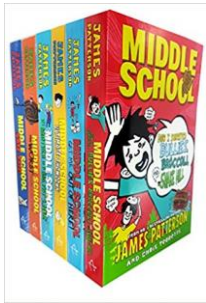

Diary of a Wimpy Kid Collection – Jeff Kinney

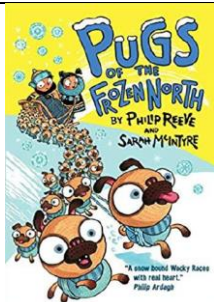

Middle School Collection – James Patterson

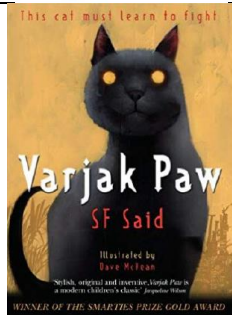

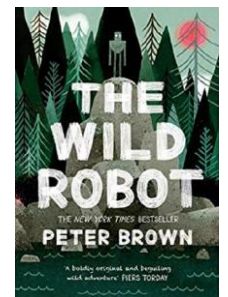
Alex Sparrow and the Really Big Stink – Jennifer Killick

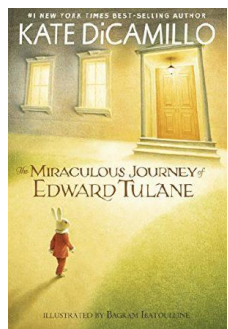
The Nothing to See Here Hotel - Steven Butler

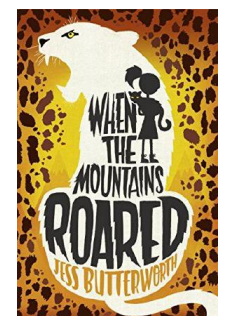
The Wild Robot – Peter Brown

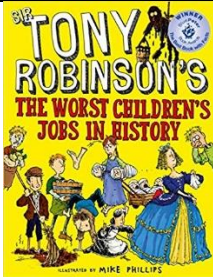


When The Mountains Roared – Jess Butterworth

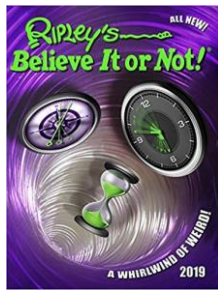
Children's Worst Jobs in History – Tony Robinson

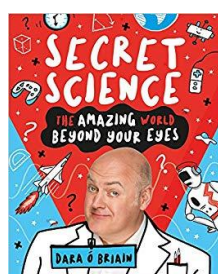

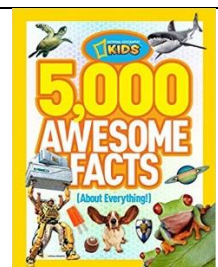
